The last JCI European Conference in Turku was organised 12.–15.6. in 1974. It was at that time the biggest JCI event ever organized in Finland and for Turku Junior Chamber a giant leap towards international activity.

Organising the EC was then – as it has been today – a huge effort for the chapter. But even if the pressure was hard, the European Conference succeeded better than was expected. The work that had been done during several years before the conference paid off. Conference Director Keijo Ketonen had a good reason to be proud of a well organized event. An event that had taken all of the members time – as well as the spouses and children that were recruited to help organizing the event.

The European Conference gathered 1298 delegates. Guests came from all over the world, over 30 nations were represented in the conference. Conference Director was Keijo Ketonen and Chairman of the Conference was JCI vice president Mike Ashton from Great Britain.

The highlight of the EC in 1974 was the European Day on Friday, June 14th. It was a high profile seminar with the keynote speakers as the Finnish Foreign Minister Ahti Karjalainen. On the last day of the conference the honorary speaker was Mr. Jyoti Shankar Singh from the United Nations.

As today, the EC in 1974 was not all just work, but it was also having fun. The important parts of the conference were for example Finnish Party, home hospitality parties and gala dinner.

Turku Cathedral

The mother church of the Lutheran Church of Finland and the country's national shrine. It is also regarded as one of the major records of Finnish architectural history.

Turku Castle

The largest castle in Finland and one of country's most magnificent national treasures.

Rent a bike

Cruise on the Aurajoki river

For decades the river ferry Pikkufoeri has transported the workers for Wärtsilä shipyards. Nowadays Forum Marinum owns the vessel and has restored it to fully operational condition to be used as a river ferry. Pikkufoeri operates daily between the Turku city centre and the Forum Marinum.

Why not go to school?!

Brewery Restaurant Koulu (School) is the biggest restaurant brewery in Finland. The restaurant occupies a refurbished old school building dating from the 1880s. The brewery pub serves excellent house-brewed beers and the wine bar has a selection of 80 wines to satisfy all tastes.

Visit the riverboats

Enjoy the nautical atmosphere of the ship restaurant Cindyn Salonki in the city centre. The kitchen relies on carefully prepared, uncomplicated food made of fish from local waters, succulent meat and fresh vegetables.
